**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2019
CAPITAL FUND BUDGET TO CLOSE A BOND
LINE THAT IS NO LONGER ACTIVE**

WHEREAS, the Comptroller of the City of Binghamton finds it proper and necessary to amend the 2019 Capital Fund budget to close a bond line that is no longer active; and

WHEREAS, the budget amendment was approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on September 11, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Comptroller and City Treasurer of the City of Binghamton are hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2019 Capital Fund budget to close a bond line that is no longer active as follows:

Transfer From (Decrease):


\$105,121.20 H7180.525102.2212 (Consultant
