### **ORDINANCE**

entitled

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW PARKING GARAGE ON WATER STREET, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$26,500,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OF THE CITY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$19,500,000 TO FINANCE THE BALANCE OF SAID APPROPRIATION

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton recognizes the need for the construction of a new parking garage on Water Street in the City and finds it in the best interest of the City to fund the cost of constructing such new garage from various sources, including ARPA funds, grants and City bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Binghamton, New York, duly convened (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Council) as follows:

Section 1. The City of Binghamton, in the County of Broome, New York (herein called the "City"), is hereby authorized to construct a new parking garage on Water Street in the City (the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of the Project, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$26,500,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor, including \$7,000,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (the "ARPA") funds allocated to the City and grant funds made available by the State of New York, each available for such purpose, such appropriation having been authorized by the Council pursuant to Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_. The plan of financing includes the expenditure of the ARPA and grant funds in the amount of \$7,000,000 available for the Project, the issuance of bonds of the City in the principal amount of not to exceed \$19,500,000 to finance the balance of said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable. Debt service on the obligations herein authorized is expected to be paid from the Parking Fund of the City. Any additional grant funds received from the United States of America, the State of New York or from any other source are authorized to be applied towards the cost of the Project or redemption of the City's bonds or notes

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issued therefore, or to be budgeted as an offset to the amounts to be collected for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds or notes.

Section 2. Bonds of the City in the principal amount of not to exceed \$19,500,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance a part of the appropriation referred to herein.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 11(a)(1) of the Law, is thirty (30) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the City for expenditures made after the effective date of this Ordinance for the purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this Ordinance, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the City. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Council relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and as to executing agreements for credit enhancements, are hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of the City.

- Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Ordinance, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:
  - (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money, or
  - (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such Ordinance, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with,

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and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 8. This Bond Ordinance shall take effect immediately, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing Ordinance, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in the "The Press & Sun-Bulletin," a newspaper published in Binghamton, New York, having a general circulation in the City and hereby designated the official newspaper of said City for such publication.



### State Environmental Quality Review Negative Declaration of Type I Action

This Notice is issued pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act) of the Environmental Conservation Law.

Nature of action. An Ordinance authorizing issuance of \$19,500,000 serial bonds to finance the reconstruction of a new paraking garage on Water Street with an estimated maximum cost of \$26,500,000. \$7,000,000 of which will be funded by allocation of American Rescue Plan Act Funds and grant funds made available from the State of New York and the balance by the issuance of bonds in the principal amount not to exceed \$19,500,000.

The City of Binghamton City Council has determined that the proposed action described above is a Type I action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, because the action is substantially contiguous to a State & National Register Historic District. Council finds no significant adverse environmental impact because the funded project involves the reconstruction of a public parking ramp on a site and within the footprint of a previously existing parking garage which had occupied the space for over 40 years. There is no significant change in the use or intensity of use of the land, and no expansion beyond the original footprint. Moreover, the proposed design of the garage and site was approved by both the Planning Commission and the Commission on Architecture and Urban Design, the latter being the City's historic preservation board. Both agencies found no significant environmental impacts and issued Negative Declarations under SEQRA.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH CJS ARCHITECTS FOR THE WATER STREET PARKING GARAGE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Permanent Resolution 23-79, adopted October 4, 2023, City Council authorized the Mayor of the City of Binghamton to enter into a professional services agreement with CJS Architects for the Water Street Parking Garage in an amount not to exceed \$22,950; and

RESOLVE that the Mayor of the City of Binghamton, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement, approved as to form and content by the Office of Corporation Counsel, with CJS Architects for the Water Street Parking Garage construction design and administration and the Boscov's roof design in an amount not to exceed \$170,932; and that funds will be available in budget line H5650.525272.10823 (Water Street Parking Garage) for this purpose.
