AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF A PORTION OF PARLOR CITY COMMONS TO CONFLUENCE PROPERTIES II, LLC

WHEREAS, the City of Binghamton is the owner of certain real properties located at Parlor City Commons, Binghamton, New York, Tax Parcel No. 160.49-1-1 (the "Premises"); and

WHEREAS, the City received an Offer to Purchase a *deminimis* portion of the Premises from Confluence Properties II, LLC (the "Applicant") for \$500 to provide additional storage for new building contruction adjacent to the property (See attached map); and

WHEREAS, the City has no public use for this portion of the Premises; and

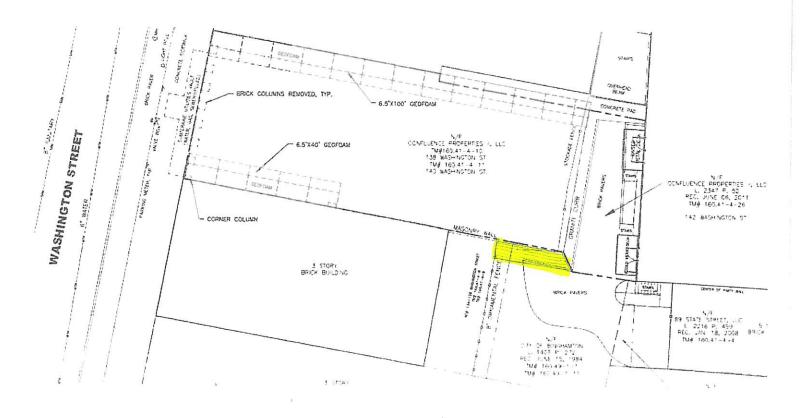
WHEREAS, the Assessor of the City of Binghamton has determined that the sale price to be fair and equitable; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment approved and recommended sale of the Premises on October 18, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain by at least a three-fourths vote as follows:

- Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of Binghamton, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract of sale and to execute all necessary and appropriate documentation, approved as to form and content by the Office of Corporation Counsel, to transfer a portion of the Premises to Confluence Properties II, LLC for \$500 to be paid by cash, certified check, or local bank check.
- Section 2. This transfer is subject to the following conditions (i) the Premises must be merged with the Applicant's adjacent property located at 138 Washington Street, Binghamton, New York into a single parcel within two years of the date of this legislation.
 - Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

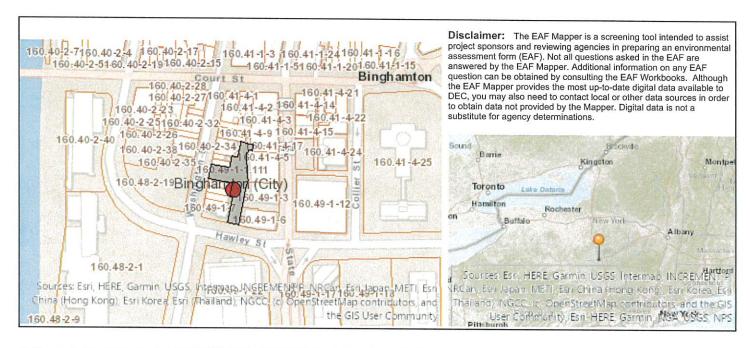
