- Maureen Wilson and Trevor Jones of Pyramid Brokerage:
 - Represent current owner of 489 Court St and 4 Berwick Ave. Have a contract for sale for properties.
 Here to discuss 4 Berwick Ave specifically, which is inaccessible except through a neighboring lot. Rear lot will be used for overflow or vehicles waiting for repair, not for impoundment of towed vehicles.
- Rob Wandell:
 - Owner of Imagicka, here for parking enforcement comments. Noticed overnight tickets issued last weekend, and thanks BPD for improving enforcement. Did note, that there were no other tickets suggesting there is no parking enforcement on Saturday. Hoping for Saturday enforcement, especially during Christmas shopping season, particularly Black Friday and Small Business Saturday. Business/property owners park all day in spite of 2 Hr signage. Mercedes and Black Sienna from Adook Food Mart are frequent offenders.
- Kevin Richmond, 31 Main St
 - Principal of BHS. It is our collective responsibility to ensure safety of students. Urges Traffic Board to add crosswalk and convert Oak St to 1-way during school hours. Thanks Sgt. Mujcic for meeting with him earlier this month. Discussed Stop Arm Camera Program which showed that Oak St had the highest number of violations in Broome County. Has seen students hit, or narrowly avoid being hit, and is a major concern. No crosswalk significantly increases likelihood of an accident. Congestion during dropoff and pickup. One-way would help with chaos/congestion. Would also allow better visibility of stop arm from buses. Added cones to alert drivers to crossing area, but was told to remove them. Reiterates request for crosswalk and one-way.

- Heiman noted that the proposed signage is not MUTCD compliant, will get an opinion from Corp. Counsel.
- A raised crosswalk has been discussed, Emergency Services will seek funding to implement from the BC Health Dept.
- Mujcic stated that all existing signage has been updated to improve visibility.
- Heiman displayed the signage proposed by Office of Emergency Services
- Paddick explained the purpose of guidelines and how they apply to the proposed signage. Met with Health Dept. Cost of crosswalk will not meet minimum for federal TAP funding.
- Resciniti asked about making the street one-way.
- Heiman stated that converting the street to one-way would have a significant impact on emergency vehicle response. Crosswalk makes more sense to implement first.
- Ryan stated that a mid-block crosswalk would require removal of several parking spots to ensure visibility of crossing for approaching traffic.
- Paddick mentioned possibly funneling students to crosswalk with fencing on curb
