AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2023 BUDGET TO ALLOCATE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS TO SUPPORT GREATER OPPORTUNITIES FOR BROOME AND CHENANGO

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Comptroller of the City of Binghamton find it proper and necessary to allocate American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in the amount of \$2,500,000 to support Greater Opportunities for Broome and Chenango in the creation of new units of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, such budget amendments were approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on December 20, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Comptroller and City Treasurer of the City of Binghamton are hereby authorized and directed to allocate ARPA funds in the amount of \$2,500,000 to support Greater Opportunities for Broome and Chenango in the creation of new units of affordable housing as follows:

- (i) \$2,500,000 increase expense budget line A9950.59000.F0015 (Interfund Transf)
- (ii) \$2,500,000 increase revenue budget line H.45031.F0015 (Interfund Transf)
- (iii) \$2,500,000 increase revenue budget line A.44089.F0015 (Fed.Aid Other)
- (iv) \$2,500,000 increase expense budget line H8686.54756.F0015 (Affor. Housing)

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
