I am pleased to inform you that we have closed the purchase 86 Walnut St in Binghamton. This is an exciting step for us to move closer to our clients and allow us to serve them better.

Per our conversation in May of 2023, I am requesting a grant of \$100,000.00 that will help to install a commercial kitchen in the Walnut St location, including the purchase of furnishings and equipment.



Dear President Mativetsky,

Since taking office, my Administration has worked collaboratively with the Salvation Army and downtown businesses to find solutions for ongoing public safety and quality of life issues stemming from the Salvation Army's current location at 131 Washington St. While the services the Salvation Army provides are critical, the location of its community meal site in the heart of our downtown business district is not ideal and the building itself no longer meets the needs of the residents it serves.

Through these discussions, the Salvation Army identified 86 Walnut St. as a well-suited new location that would be closer to many of the residents they serve and provide the physical building space, parking and security it needs. It's also another investment in the North of Main Neighborhood, supporting ongoing community efforts to fight food insecurity in the neighborhood.

To facilitate this effort and speed up Salvation Army's timeline for relocation, I have committed \$100,000 in ARPA funding for buildout of a new commercial kitchen at 86 Walnut St. The funding will greatly improve the non-profit's operations and ability to serve our most vulnerable residents. Currently, the building does not have the commercial kitchen, equipment and furnishings required.

With this investment, we can ensure continuity of a major food insecurity relief program and support the hardworking small business owners on Washinton Street and downtown Binghamton by creating a better environment for their patrons and employees.
