



#### Mayor Kraham Announces Settlement Banning Notorious Landlord Isaac Anzaroot from Binghamton Real Estate Business for 15 Years

(BINGHAMTON, N.Y.) — Mayor Jared M. Kraham on Thursday announced a major court settlement against Isaac Anzaroot, banning the downstate landlord from owning or managing property in Binghamton for the next 15 years and transferring control of 26 of Anzaroot's properties to the City.

**Mayor Jared M. Kraham** said: "No one person has done more harm to Binghamton's neighborhoods than Isaac Anzaroot. From my first day in office, I promised to hold bad actors accountable and send a clear message that we will not tolerate slumlords who put families in danger and hurt the integrity of our neighborhoods. This deal delivers a huge victory to residents, banning the area's most notorious landlord from owning property in Binghamton for the next 15 years. It's the most sweeping action taken against a problem property owner in memory and a major turning point for Binghamton's neighborhoods."

Under the <u>Court-approved settlement agreement</u>, Anzaroot is barred from participating in any real estate business in the City of Binghamton for 15 years, including owning, managing or operating residential and commercial properties.

Anzaroot will transfer 26 properties to the City of Binghamton. Due to pending judgments and garnishments against Anzaroot, the City will retain a fund with the appraised value of the properties approximately \$751,000 after owed taxes, water bills and other fees — pending any court orders directing the funds'

As part of the settlement, Anzaroot will drop all active litigation against the City of Binghamton and waive all future claims. The City will dismiss its current criminal prosecutions against Anzaroot and associated LLCs.

Anzaroot has owned more than a hundred properties across the City under various LLCs in recent years, accruing countless housing code violations for the properties' poor conditions.

In 2022, Anzaroot was arrested by Binghamton Police on 12 bench warrants and two arrest warrants for housing code violations.

Beyond the 26 properties being transferred to the City, all of Anzaroot's remaining properties in Binghamton are in court-ordered receivership or pending mortgage or tax foreclosure.

The 26 properties the City will take title to include several on Henry Street and near the Stadium District, four on Fayette Street and two on Hawley Street.

The City will seek to demolish, rehabilitate, sell or otherwise redevelop the parcels to support neighborhood revitalization.

§ 1290. Legislative purpose. It is hereby declared and found that there exists across upstate New York, and particularly in the cities of Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Albany, and Binghamton, a shortage of affordable housing units available for purchase. It is further found that homeownership is essential for building generational wealth, and that the state therefore has an interest in promoting homeownership. In order, further, to promote homeownership, it is hereby declared that additional provisions should be made to provide public monies for the purposes of one- to two- family dwellings in the cities of Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Albany, and Binghamton for purchase by low and moderate income buyers living in or near the census tract where the property is located. The necessity in the public interest for the provisions of this article is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

- § 1291. Infill housing pilot program. 1. The division of housing and community renewal shall, subject to appropriation, develop a program to make capital subsidies available for the purpose of building one- to two-family dwellings in the cities of Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Albany, and Binghamton. The commissioner shall promulgate rules and regulations sufficient for the creation of a new program for the purpose of building such one- to two-family dwellings.
- 2. Funding for the program created pursuant to this article shall, to the extent practicable, be prioritized for development on vacant, abandoned, or under-utilized land owned by the municipality.
- 3. Dwellings created pursuant to this program shall be sold to a not-for-profit corporation for the purpose of resale or individuals or families who are low or moderate income, as determined by the division of housing and community renewal, at the time of sale, who own no other real property, and who intend to use the dwelling as their primary residence.
- 4. The division of housing and community renewal shall restrict any subsequent deed of sale to an individual or family of low or moderate income, as determined by the division of housing and community renewal, who intends to make the dwelling their primary residence.
- 5. Nothing in this article shall preclude the use of additional loans or grants in conjunction with this program.

#### Article XII

## PROHIBITION OF OPERATION OF OFF-ROAD VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON

#### § 400-115. Legislative findings, Intent and purpose.

The Mayor and City Council find that despite the clear prohibition in Section 2403 of Article 48-c of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law "Rules for Operation of All Terrain Vehicles," the number of incidents involving the Illegal operation of ATVs and dirt bikes in the City of Binghamton and across New York State have steadily increased. The operation of illegal, unregistered dirt bikes, ATVs, and other non-street legal vehicles on the streets and parks in the City of Binghamton impact the public safety and quality of life of those who live and work in the City of Binghamton. These off-road vehicles pose a danger to the drivers and passengers of the legal vehicles operating on City streets, the public at large, and the patrons of City parks. Furthermore, the excessive noise created by the operation of these vehicles, which are not designed for use within city limits, often occurs late at night, disturbing the peace and quiet of City neighborhoods.

The purpose of this legislation is to strengthen the ability of the Binghamton Police Department to ensure public safety and the general welfare of the City of Binghamton and its citizens by providing a local law to deter the illegal operation of off-road vehicles in the City of Binghamton and in City parks by imposing a fine or imprisonment, impoundment of the off-road vehicle being operated illegally, and allowing for a redemption fee to be charged by the Binghamton Police Department in addition to the separate fees to be paid to the towing company who stores the impounded vehicle for the Binghamton Police Department.

#### § 400-116. Definitions.

For purposes of this article, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

Off-road vehicles. All-terrain vehicles (sometimes referred to as ATVs) as that term is defined in Section 2281(1) of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; Off-highway motorcycles as that term is defined in Section 125-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; Motocross or dirt bikes; dune buggies; go-carts; and any and all other types of motorized trail bikes or vehicles that are manufactured for sale or operation primarily on off-highway trails or for off-highway competitions and are only incidentally operated on public highways. Nothing contained herein, however, shall be deemed to apply to or prohibit the use of bicycles.

Operate: To ride in or on, other than as a passenger, or use or control the operation of an off-road vehicle in any manner, whether or not said off-road vehicle is under way.

Operator: Every person who operates or is in actual physical control of an off-road vehicle.

Public highway: Any highway, road, alley, street, avenue, public place, public driveway, or any other public way.

#### § 400-117. Restrictions.

- (a) Public property. No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on a public highway or on any public property in the City of Binghamton. Use of off-road vehicles is also prohibited in all City parks pursuant to section §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton.
- (b) Private property. No person shall operate an off-road vehicle off a public highway on private property in the City of Binghamton unless such person has first obtained the express consent of the owner or occupant of such property to operate the off-road vehicle on the property. There shall be a rebuttable presumption that the operator of an off-road vehicle on private property in the City of Binghamton lacks consent to operate the off-road vehicle on private property.

#### § 400-118. Penalties for offenses, impoundment and redemption.

- (a) The first time any person is found to be operating an off-road vehicle in violation of the provisions of §400-117 (a) or (b) or in violation of §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton, it shall be punishable as a violation with a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed fifteen (15) days or both. The second time any person is found to be operating an off-road vehicle in violation of the provisions of §400-117 (a) or (b) or §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton, it shall be punishable as a violation with a fine not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) or imprisonment not to exceed fifteen (15) days or both. For the third and all subsequent violations of the provisions of §400-117 (a) or (b) or §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton, the person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment not to exceed one year or both.
- (b) Any violation of the provisions of §400-117(a) or (b) or of §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton shall apply towards the escalation of penalties for any future violations of either this article or §301-4.
- (c) In addition to the penalties set forth in subsection (a) of this section, a police officer may immediately impound an off-road vehicle that has been operated in violation of §400-117 (a) or (b) or of §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton. The City of Binghamton utilizes various towing companies to assist with the towing and storage of vehicles seized and impounded by the Binghamton Police Department. Off-road vehicles impounded pursuant to this subsection shall be stored at the Binghamton Police Department impound, pending the identification of the owner of such off-road vehicle as registered with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Such title owner shall be sent a notice of impoundment at the address on file with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles by certified mail within five (5) days after the impoundment. Neither the police department impounding such off-road vehicle, nor the City of Binghamton, nor any agent nor any employee thereof, shall be liable for any damages arising out of the provision of an erroneous name or address of such owner. The owner of the off-road vehicle operated in violation of §400-117(a) or (b) or of §301-4 of the Code of the City of Binghamton may redeem

such off-road vehicle upon satisfactory proof of ownership and payment of a redemption fee of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). Satisfactory proof of ownership shall be consistent with the documentation that is required by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles to register the off-road vehicle. An off-road vehicle impounded under this subsection shall only be released to the owner of such off-road vehicle, or to such owner's agent as evidenced by a written, notarized proof of agency, or duly executed power of attorney.

#### § 400-119. Enforcement.

The Chief of Police is charged with the enforcement of the provisions of this article.

#### § 400-120. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this article or application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be judged by any court to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph or part thereof and the persons or circumstances, directly involved in the controversy in which the judgment shall be rendered.

#### **CHAPTER 301 PARKS AND RECREATION**

#### §301-4 Prohibition of operation of off-road vehicles in City parks.

No person shall operate or drive or cause to be operated or driven upon, within any of the City parks or playgrounds an off-road vehicle.

For purposes of this section an off-road vehicle shall be defined as: All-terrain vehicles (sometimes referred to as ATVs) as that term is defined in Section 2281(1) of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; Off-highway motorcycles as that term is defined in Section 125-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; motocross or dirt bikes; dune buggies; go-carts; and any and all other types of motorized trail bikes or vehicles that are manufactured for sale or operation primarily on off-highway trails or for off-highway competitions and are only incidentally operated on public highways. Nothing contained herein, however, shall be deemed to apply to or prohibit the use of bicycles.

Persons found to be operating off-road vehicles in City parks in violation of this section shall be subject to the same penalties as listed in §400-118 of the Code of the City of Binghamton. A violation of this section shall apply towards the escalation of penalties set forth in §400-118 for any future violations of either this section or §400-117(a) or (b).

- $\$  400-18. Fee for impounded vehicles; disposition of fees. [Added 2-5-2001 by Ord. No. 01-6; amended 10-21-2002 by Ord. No. 02-119]
- A. A fee per day as set from time to time by the City Council shall be charged to the registered owner of any vehicle impounded by the City of Binghamton Police Department as a storage fee payable to the City prior to the owner of said vehicle regaining possession of said vehicle (See Exhibit J).
- B. The term "per day" as defined herein shall mean that said fine shall be levied for any portion of a twenty-four-hour period that the vehicle remains upon the City's impound lot.
- C. The Comptroller shall establish a police vehicle fund identified as "H3120.9022," to which he or she shall increase appropriations in said line for the purpose of purchasing new police vehicles except as to impound fees collected under section 400-118 of Chapter 400, which fees shall, after the costs of impoundment and storage, go into the budget line for youth programming identified as A7310.54163.F0015.



Pursuant to your request, I have prepared and now send to you a draft of the Extract of Minutes of the Council meeting to be held April 24, 2024 showing adoption of the above bond ordinance and providing for publication of such ordinance, in summary. The bond ordinance requires at least a two-thirds vote of the full Council for adoption, without taking into consideration any temporary absences or vacancies.

A summary of the bond ordinance with the prescribed form of Clerk's statutory notice affixed in readiness for publication in the official City newspaper is also included. As you know, publication of the bond ordinance, in summary, commences a 20-day statute of limitations period pursuant to the provisions of Section 80.00 et seq. of the Local Finance Law. The publication of the legal notice should be made as soon as possible following adoption of the ordinance by the Council.

#### ORDINANCE

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON, NEW YORK, ADOPTED APRIL 24, 2024, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$3,836,000 TO FINANCE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND UPGRADES TO THE TERMINAL PUMPING STATION JOINTLY OWNED BY THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON AND THE VILLAGE OF JOHNSON CITY, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$7,000,000, APPROPRIATING \$3,836,000 TO PAY THE CITY'S LOCAL SHARE OF SUCH COST; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,836,000 BONDS OF THE CITY TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION; AND APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT FOR SUCH PURPOSE

#### Recital

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton (the "City") recognizes the need to construct improvements and upgrades to the Terminal Pumping Station jointly owned by the City (54%) and the Village of Johnson City (45.2%) (the "Village");

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Council) as follows:

Section 1. The City of Binghamton, in the County of Broome, New York, is hereby authorized to construct improvements and upgrades to the Terminal Pumping Station jointly owned by the City and the Village. The estimated total cost of the foregoing, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$7,000,000. The amount of \$3,836,000 is hereby appropriated by the City to pay the City's local share of such cost, such appropriation having been authorized by the Council pursuant to Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$3,836,000 bonds of the City to finance the amount appropriated to pay the City's local share of such cost, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable. Sewer rents have been imposed in the City pursuant to the City Charter and it is expected that such rents will continue to be imposed and collected by the City and the amounts derived therefrom shall be budgeted and used as an offset to the taxes to be levied and collected. The \$3,164,000 balance of the cost of the project is to be paid by the Village's expenditure of \$3,164,000 Village funds to pay the Village's local share of the cost of the project, which amount is expected to be financed by the issuance of \$3,164,000 bonds of the Village. All or part of the cost of the project may be financed through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) State Revolving Fund (SRF) and/or grants, and any authorized officer of the City is hereby authorized to submit an application and perform any other acts necessary to

arrange for such financing. Any grant funds received by the City and any other funds available for such purpose are authorized to be applied toward the cost of said project or redemption of the City's bonds or notes issued therefor, or to be budgeted as an offset to the taxes to be collected for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds or notes.

Section 2. Bonds of the City in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$3,836,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the bonds herein authorized, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 4. of the Law, is forty (40) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the City for expenditures made after the effective date of this ordinance for the purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the City. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds,

and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this ordinance and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Council relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and as to executing agreements for credit enhancements, are hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of the City.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such ordinance, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
  - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect immediately, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing ordinance, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in the "The Press & Sun-Bulletin," a newspaper published in Binghamton, New York, having a general circulation in the City and hereby designated the official newspaper of said City for such publication.
