President Mativetsky,

I have vetoed Ordinance 24-62, An Ordinance to Amend the Code of the City of Binghamton, Chapter 26.

State law and this newly drafted version of our code require these materials be posted within 24-hours of the meeting "to the extent practicable." The prior version of the law that was recently changed by Council required that "A digital copy of every proposed Local Law, Ordinance, or Resolution shall be available to the Mayor and City of Binghamton employees at least 24 hours prior to its inclusion as first read legislation." I support this prior language as it places a stricter burden on City government to make sure that the public, and City Hall staff and employees, are on notice of the items up for discussion by a public body.

Prior to this veto message, I reached out to get input from Council members. Part of the input I received is that there is good faith confusion as to what "the extent practicable" means legally. This deserves further discussion, as does exploring practical barriers in the posting of materials and the timeline of legislative actions.

Keeping this local strict 24-hour requirement is a good backstop against costly litigation. If City Council fails to publish its agenda and resolutions in accordance with state Open Meetings Law, it opens the City to potential litigation which could invalidate legislation. The litigation would require in-house legal resources to defend these claims or outside counsel expenses.

In sum, I don't yet understand Council's intent or have yet to hear a reasonable argument that requires this change. When dealing with matters of open government, we should err on the side of greater transparency and notice unless there is a compelling argument against it.

Section 1: Chapter 26, City Council, §26-6 Legislative procedure for drafting of local laws, ordinances and resolutions, Subsection D, be amended as follows:

D. A digital copy of every proposed Local Law, Ordinance, or Resolution shall be available to the Mayor and City of Binghamton employees to the extent practicable and in accordance with Public Officers Law, Article 7 (Open Meetings Law) at least 24 hours prior to its inclusion as first read legislation.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately.
