AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2021 FIRE BUDGET TO ADD ONE ADDITIONAL FIREFIGHTER UNTIL AUGUST 1, 2021

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief and Comptroller of the City of Binghamton find it proper and necessary to amend the 2021 Fire Budget to add one additional firefighter until August 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, such budget amendment was approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on March 24, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in special session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Comptroller and City Treasurer of the City of Binghamton are hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2021 Fire Budget to add one additional firefighter until Augiust 1, 2021 as follows.

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE 2021 BINGHAMTON POLICE REFORM & REINVENTION COLLABORATIVE PLAN

WHEREAS, in June 2020, New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo signed Executive Order 203, New York State Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative, requiring local governments to convene a variety of local stakeholders in the community to perform a comprehensive review of current police policies and procedures and to create a plan to adopt and implement recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Binghamton and Chief of Police convened the Binghamton Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative, consisting of a variety of community leaders, including the Broome County District Attorney, Broome County Public Defender, members of the Binghamton Police Bureau, members of City Council, Binghamton City School District Superintendent, Binghamton City School District Board Members, local NAACP Chapter President, neighborhood watch and neighborhood assembly coordinators, faith leaders, and residents representing the professional fields of social work, human resources, workplace diversity, and youth services; and

WHEREAS, the 2021 Binghamton Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative, together with an independent consultant, John F. Finn Institute for Public Safety, Inc., held six public listening sessions, provided a community survey with approximately 1,400 responses, and maintained an open portal for comments, of which over 600 pages of written comments were received; and

WHEREAS, the John F. Finn Institute for Public Safety, Inc. issued a report, Binghamton Police Reform and Reinvention: Current Practice, Community Input, and Empirical Evidence, analyzing police data to assess current racial and ethnic disparities in policing in Binghamton, public comment and community survey data, and reviewing and assessing Binghamton police strategies, policies and practices against scientific best practices; and

WHEREAS, the Binghamton Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative approved the 2021 Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative Plan, consisting of 310 pages, including a Police Department Overview, the Binghamton Police Reform and Reinvention:
