Public Comment:

- Rob Wandell:
 - Owner of Imagicka, stating that increase in parking enforcement in Court St 2 hour parking zone seems to be having an impact. Wants to know if vacant parking officer position has been filled. (Mujcic states that BPD is still conducting interviews). Noted that only one officer is currently writing tickets, and would like additional officers to write tickets. (Ryan states that other officers assigned to that post are able to write tickets, but that there are priorities in their duties that are above parking enforcement). Would like the City to fix the loophole in the kiosk app; spaces are 2 hour maximum, but the app lets users add an additional 2 consecutive hours repeatedly all day. (Heiman noted that the City is in discussions with the vendor, Flobird, on this issue). Repeated that the issues are improving, but wants to encourage continued enforcement. (Ryan states that BPD is aware of his concerns and they are being addressed).
- Kevin Richman, Principal of BHS
 - O Wants to discuss safety around dismissal procedures, and noted that the issue was first raised over a year ago. Noted that Oak St has the most school bus stop arm violations in the County. Wants a crosswalk as soon as possible, and despite new high-visibility sign, a crosswalk is still needed. Believes that students are at risk due to chaotic conditions at dismissal. Believes that delaying the installation of a crosswalk further will lead to more incidents.

NEW BUSINESS

ADDRESS: Kane Ave

DESCRIPTION FROM AGENDA: Request to move No Parking signs to the W side of the street to not obstruct mailboxes located on the E side of the street

APPLICANT: Hadassah Mativetsky

DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Mativetsky summarized the concern, stating that the no parking signs are moving cars to the side of the street where mailboxes are located, preventing mail delivery. Stated that the no parking signs were originally installed due to the street being too narrow for emergency vehicle access when cars were parked on both sides. Did outreach among residents on Kane Ave. Read one letter which reiterated mail delivery problem and would like the signs moved to the opposite of the street immediately. Noted that one resident had to move his mailbox. Tallied 8 votes in favor of moving signs, 2 against moving signs. Noted that those opposed to moving the signs want them to remain because there would be less parking available if parking were switched to the opposite side, due to the presence of fire hydrants.
- Heiman noted that the Mayor's Office has gotten one request to move the signs. Has no objection to moving the signs, and noted that DPW has stated that moving the signs would make snow removal easier on Kane Ave.
- Mativetsky stated that there is confusion regarding no parking signs and alternate side parking.
- Mujcic noted that there is an existing City ordinance that prohibits parking in front of mailboxes. Also noted that constituents should be aware that available parking will be reduced by moving the signs.
- Heiman asked Mativetsky if constituents would generally be ok with reduced parking
- Mativetsky responded that properties have driveways, the block is not densely populated, and that the consensus is that moving the signs is more important than maximizing on-street parking.

do not warrant a 4-way stop, and that adding a stop sign on such a steep grade could cause safety issues for
drivers moving uphill in inclement weather. Would like to collect more data before voting.
