Public Comment:

- Tom McNamara, 13 Woodland Ave:
 - Wants to address the change of Woodland Ave to one way. There have been many accidents on the corner of Woodland and Mary. Thinks it's strange to change the direction of a portion of the street for one property and one season. Believes speeding is the issue. There are no speed limit signs. Need speed limit signs and enforcement. Changing the direction of the street will be a hardship to local traffic. Has never had a problem over the winter. Believes the change will cause more accidents when drivers are caught off guard by the change to one-way.
- James Zervos, 74 Woodland Ave
 - Lifelong resident that has lived on Woodland for over 30 years. The bigger problem is the intersection of Woodland and Mary. Has personally responded to many accidents as a firefighter. Does not believe plowing and salting is sufficient. Thinks a Stop Ahead sign would be helpful.
- Lucy Durlam, 4 Pratt Court
 - o Is opposed to the change of Woodland Ave to one-way. Woodland is a major thoroughfare to get down the hill, and all of the drivers that use it would be greatly inconvenienced. There are already limited options to get off the hill, changing the direction of Woodland Ave would make matters worse. Does not believe that 5 accidents is a justification for the change, given the large number of vehicles that move down the street daily. Change would adversely affect mail delivery and other services, most of which are done going downhill. Would also adversely affect emergency services. Does not believe that City can fix bad judgement of some drivers in the winter by changing traffic patterns.

- How will emergency services get to people in the event of an emergency? If the change adds 5 minutes to their travel, it could cost a life. Would like to know what alternatives have been reviewed; e.g. slower speed limit, clearing brush, etc.
- Richard Durlam, 4 Pratt Court
 - Has lived in the area for several decades and understands that one has to drive cautiously in the winter.
 Believes speeding is the problem. Mail is delivered going down the hill. Changing the direction of the street would require residents to move their mailboxes.
- Jeremiah Brown, 43 Thorpe St
 - Noted an improvement in enforcement since the last meeting, but it has tapered off. Would like the Board to consider alternatives to increased enforcement.
- Amanda Giannone, S. Washington St
 - Appreciates neighbors' concerns. Wants to note that there are more accidents than what is reported.
 Has had the guardrail and mailbox multiple times in the past 2 years. It is difficult to preemptively salt the road, and understands that it cannot always be done before a snow event. Agrees that speeding is a concern, however, has seen multiple instances of cars sliding down the hill at slow speeds.

- Heiman notes that BPD increased enforcement around Memorial Day and is happy to hear that it was helpful. States that BMTS found that the crash data doesn't support a 4-way stop and recommended denial of the request. Thinks there may be striping that can help, including stop bars and crosswalks. Have also used oversized stop signs in the past, and does not require Traffic Board approval. Speed radar signs are an option, as well. Would recommend speed radar signs. Heiman states that a review of what signs may be missing, including speed limit signs, will happen.
- Ryan is in favor of a solar speed radar sign being installed in this area. Agrees that there is a speed problem, but enforcement manpower isn't always available. Reiterates that speed trailer would help.
- Jeremiah Brown asks whether speed cameras are an option.
- Ryan states that there is not a current speed camera program in place.
