- F. Compensation for Assistant Police Chiefs (up to two positions). Effective July 10, 2010, Assistant Police Chiefs are officers and employees not covered by a collective bargaining agreement and will receive salary and benefits as follows: (1) Base salary of \$74,635 and "other compensation" consistent with General Municipal Law § 207-m, as may be amended from time to time. (2) Increases to base salary and "other compensation" consistent with General Municipal Law § 207-m, as may be amended from time to time; to wit as of July 10, 2010, the Assistant Police Chiefs will receive at least the same dollar amount increase in base salary and increases in "other compensation" as a permanent full-time police officer who is a member of a negotiating unit and who is the highest ranking subordinate to the Assistant Police Chiefs, i.e., a Captain, in such unit. The Assistant Chiefs will be eligible for overtime as may be directed by the Commissioner of Public Safety (the Mayor). Overtime will be paid at time and one-half in the applicable pay period. Assistant Chiefs are not entitled to compensatory time off in lieu of overtime payments.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately.
