Regarding an update on the status of the Department's rescue truck:

The truck — Squad 21 — is at headquarters, currently in the temporary location on Court Street. The apparatus not only helps with fire suppression efforts, but is responsible for the equipment and operations of our technical rescue capabilities. The truck houses our "jaws of life" equipment, and supports confined space and rope rescue operations.

There is an immediate and critical need to replace this fire apparatus.

Squad 21 has had multiple high-pressure oil pump replacements. Two in the last year and two in recent past. These failures indicate the engine has a probability of a catastrophic failure. Current Mileage is 92,820 and 10,925 engine hours. The industry formula for hour to mileage calculation states: 1 hour engine run time equals 70 miles. Using that formula it roughly equals 765,000 miles of service. Industry normal heavy duty truck usage is 500,000 miles. Rescue 21 is more equivalent to severe service usage.

There are other factors that necessitate replacement as well, including body condition, dated emergency lighting and worn down on-board equipment (including generator and ladder racking).

My staff has been able to source a demo rescue truck that meets our specifications, which is available now. This cuts down on the typical 2+ year build time for new fire apparatus.

Dear Mayor Kraham,

We write you this letter in support of the effort of Chief Gardiner and his staff in replacing our only Rescue Truck. This effort has been ongoing for several years but has been unsuccessful due to other department, city priorities and budgetary constraints. This truck plays a vital role in our departments mission not only in fire suppression but in other aspects of our operations such as technical rescue including extrication (jaws of life), rope rescue and confined space to name a few.

We feel at this point it has become a health and safety concern not only for the firefighters that operate the truck but for the citizens it protects. Outlined are some our immediate concerns;

- Per NFPA guidelines the truck is past its recommended use of 15 years as a front-line piece of apparatus.
- Because of its age it no longer meets numerous improved NFPA guidelines that have changed since its
 production, with which these guidelines protect the operating firefighters and citizens it is designed and used to
 protect.
- Based on our fire mechanics assessment, looking at previous mechanical issues, mileage and engine hours, catastrophic engine failure is not a matter of if, but when. Obviously, having a breakdown enroute to an emergency of any kind can cost lives. Also, the time out service is detrimental to our mission and the cost of repairs is an added negative.

Besides the numerous direct health and safety concerns, keeping this truck operational has been and will continue to be challenging and will grow as a budgetary drain. Numerous mechanical and body failures are costing the department and the city annually 10's of thousands of dollars to keep it in service.

It is our understanding through Chief Gardiner and his staffs' efforts, a demo rescue truck option has been identified and would save the taxpayer 100's of thousands and would be available for immediate acquisition as opposed to the current specification and production time of approximately 2.5 years. It is our assessment waiting this long would be harmful to the fire department operations and the city budget.

For all these reasons and more IAFF Local 729 and its members strongly advise for its immediate replacement. We are available for questions and appreciate you and city council making public safety a priority, not only for us, but the residents we all strive to serve and protect.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton recognizes the need to provide for various capital improvements in and for the City, as more specifically described herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Council) as follows:

Date: March 9, 2022

Section 1. The City of Binghamton, in the County of Broome, New York (herein called the "City"), is hereby authorized to construct, acquire or undertake the various projects as described in Column A of said Schedule I, attached hereto and made a part hereof, at the estimated maximum costs indicated in Column B of said Schedule I. The estimated total cost of such projects, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$9,370,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor, such appropriation having been authorized by the Council pursuant to Ordinance Nos. 19-16, and . The plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds of the City in the principal amount of not to exceed \$9,370,000 to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable. Debt service on the obligations herein authorized is expected to be paid from the respective funds of the City set forth in Column D of said Schedule I. Any grant funds received from the United States of America, the State of New York or from any other source, including the grant funds referenced in Column E of said Schedule I, in connection with the various projects described in Column A of said Schedule I, are authorized to be applied towards the cost of said projects or redemption of the City's bonds or notes issued therefor, or to be budgeted as an offset to the amounts to be collected for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds or notes.

Section 2. Bonds of the City in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$9,370,000 are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amounts indicated in Column C of said Schedule I for each of the respective objects or purposes indicated in Column A of said Schedule I, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance the appropriation referred to herein.

Section 3. The respective periods of probable usefulness of the specific objects or purposes and classes of objects or purposes for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of §11.00 a. of the Law as referenced in Column G of said Schedule I, are set forth in Column F of said Schedule I.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the City for expenditures made after the effective date of this ordinance for the purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the City. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

This Amendment for Water Charges and Use dated as of this _____, day of December, 2021, by and between the Town of Vestal, New York, 605 Vestal Parkway West, Vestal NY 13850 (the "Town"), and the City of Binghamton, 38 Hawley Street, Binghamton, NY 13901 (the "City").

WHEREAS, on or about December 18, 1957, the Town and City entered into an Agreement regarding the location and construction of specified water infrastructure, the supply of water and consideration therefore including tax exemption for certain sewage treatment facilities, now known as the Binghamton Johnson City Joint Sewage Treatment Facilities ("BJCJSTF") to be located in the Town and operated by the City, and subsequently amended to be operated by the City and the Village of Johnson City; and

WHEREAS, the 1957 Agreement has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to further amend the Agreements regarding (i) charges for water and sewer and (ii) the supply of water from the City to the Town when requested.

NOW THEREFORE, based on the mutual promises herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. As of January 1, 2022, the Town will have the exclusive right to bill the BJCJSTF for all water charges. Any outstanding water charges billed by the City for usage prior to January 1, 2022, will be paid to the City. Water charges billed the BJCJSTF by the Town prior to January 1, 2022 will be waived.
- 2. The City will provide water to the Town when requested in writing, via email or other writing, by the Town. The City will charge inside City user rates for the water so provided. As part of this agreement the Town may use up to 100,000 cubic feet (748,000 gallons) a month free of charge until December 31, 2026
- 3. The City will waive any prior charges for water provided to the Town, and in particular, waives a water bill dated April 1, 2020, and all related late fees and interest, in the amount of \$ 5,000.60.
- 4. Except as set forth herein, the 1957 Agreement, as previously amended, remains in full force and effect.
- 5. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement is contingent upon the agreement of the BJCJSTF to the provisions of item (1) above and will be bound thereby.



If (i) the BJCJSTF extends its facilities beyond its current location at 4480 Vestal Rd, Vestal, NY 13850 and (ii) such new location requires sewage to pass through Town or City sewer lines, then the Town or City, as may be applicable, may bill the BJCJSTF for sewer usage related to the extension.
