AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON HISTORIC GUIDELINES, CHAPTER 7, COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS & STOREFRONTS - SIGNAGE, TO AMEND LANGUAGE

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton wishes to amend the City of Binghamton Historic Guidelines, Chapter 7, Guidelines for Commercial Buildings & Storefronts – Signage, to amend language.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Binghamton Historic Guidelines, Chapter 7, Guidelines for Commercial Buildings & Storefronts – Signage, to amend language as follows:

Lighting:

- Internally lit signs are generally inappropriate for historic buildings and districts.
- While internally lit signs are generally inappropriate for historic buildings and districts, illumination by light shining through stencil cut letters (preferably with a dark background), in a style considered appropriate or fitting to the building, will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Internally lit, plastic faced, cabinet-type/box signs are not appropriate.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
