ADDRESS: 33 West State Street

CASE NUMBER: CAUD-2023-15

DESCRIPTION FROM AGENDA: The City of Binghamton intends to acquire and demolish the structures and pavement on the site for the following purposes:

- expansion of the City's existing and adjacent Cheri Lindsey Park located at the northern portion of the proposed site by approximately 2.25 acres to provide for additional and enhanced facilities, amenities, and open space.
- Improving public access to the existing and adjacent multi-use River Walk located along the eastern bank of the Chenango River and at the western portion of the proposed site, together with related improvements constituting approximately 9.5 acres
- Clearing and preparation of the remaining 12.45 acres of the site along W State Street for an as yet undetermined productive use, most likely involving a mix of commercial and residential uses.

Determination of Significance for Demolition

DISCUSSION POINTS & THOSE SPEAKING:

Staff presented the application.

- The City of Binghamton is considering acquiring and demolishing the structures on the site predominately for the expansion of Cheri Lindsey Park and the Chenango River Promenade.
- Seeking Determination of Significance for Demolition since all buildings on property are over 40 years old.
- The City Council is ultimately in control over acquisition of 33 W. State St.
- City Council must be elected as lead SEQR agency for project.
- Representatives for the City of Binghamton therefore, are asking CAUD permission to act as lead agency for the purposes of SEQR determination.
- The buildings in question are located on old city dump property.
- Acquisition to expand park, but also to increase access to Chenango River.
- It will provide economic opportunity to commercial properties along W. State St. as well.
- Applicants stated that eminent domain process may take a long time until voting on this agenda item is brought back before the commission.



Dear Mr. Lake,

Hunt Engineers, Architects, Land Surveyors & Landscape Architect DPC (HUNT) was pleased to hear that we were selected to perform the visual inspections of the railroad bridges located within the City of Binghamton limits.

In order to assist you with this project we propose the following Scope of Services:

SCOPE OF SERVICES

1. Data Collection

- HUNT will meet with the City to review the list of structures to be inspected (28 structures assumed) and will gather and review any available data regarding these structures that the City may have. During our interview it was mentioned that portions of some of these structures may fall under the City's maintenance responsibility so any information regarding maintenance responsibility would be valuable to review prior to performing the visual inspections.
- HUNT will then obtain and review the most recent Railroad and NYSDOT Inspection Reports for the identified structures.
- Following the review of the previous inspection reports, HUNT staff will perform thorough
 visual inspections of all of the identified structures and document current conditions. Special
 emphasis will be given to any items that could potentially affect the load carrying capacity and
 safety of the structures. Detailed photos, inspection notes, sketches, and measurements (as
 necessary) will be gathered during the visual inspections.

2. Report Preparation

 HUNT will then compile this information into individual inspection reports for each structure. These reports will include a summary of the overall condition of each bridge as well as a list of any findings of concerns with corresponding photos.

- In addition to the individual inspection reports, a summary that includes all of the structures listed in order of concern will be provided for the City's information.
- HUNT staff will meet with City officials to review the findings of the reports. It is assumed that three hardcopies of the reports along with electronic copies will be transmitted to the City upon completion.

PROJECT PARAMETERS

- The inspections will be limited to visual inspections that can be performed within the public right of way and are not meant to take the place of the required annual inspections performed by the Railroad. These inspections are meant to serve as a tool to assist the City with taking action to ensure that any necessary safety items are addressed by the bridge owners.
- Load ratings to determine safe load capacity or detailed repair plans are not included in the scope of this project.
- It is understood that this project will be progressed with local funding and no other funding agency procedures, reviews or approvals will be required.

SCHEDULE

HUNT understands that the City would like to have these reports in hand as soon as practical therefore HUNT proposes to complete the inspections and submit the corresponding inspection reports to the City within 60 days of receiving a signed agreement from the City.

FEE

HUNT proposes to complete the above Scope of Services for a Lump Sum fee of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00).

Project-related disbursements are not included in the fees above and will be billed as they are incurred. Plotting, photocopies, prints, and mileage will be invoiced according to HUNT's current schedule of fees. A budget of \$1,000 is recommended for reimbursements.
