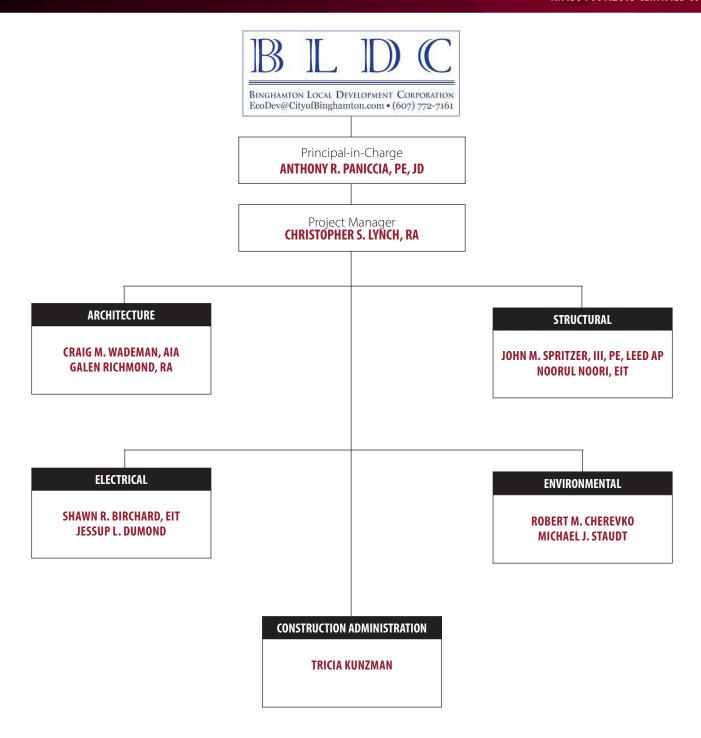

The exterior facade of the Tioga County Courthouse building is constructed of brick with stone accenting around windows and at multiple horizontal bands. A portion of the stone fell, causing concern for the safety of the public walking by.
