ORDINANCE

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS TO MIRABITO STADIUM TO COMPLY WITH THE MANDATES OF MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IF \$2,750,000, APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT FOR SUCH PURPOSE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OF THE CITY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$2,750,000 TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton recognizes the need to provide for the construction of various improvements to Mirabito Stadium in the City to comply with the mandates of Major League Baseball, as more specifically described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. The City of Binghamton, in the County of Broome, New York (herein called the "City"), is hereby authorized to construct various improvements to Mirabito Stadium to comply with the mandates of Major League Baseball (the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of the Project, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$2,750,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor, such appropriation having been authorized by the Council pursuant to Ordinance No. 21-135. The plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds of the City in the principal amount of not to exceed \$2,750,000 to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable. Fund balance of the City and/or grant funds received from the United States of America, the State of New York or from any other source, are authorized to be applied towards the cost of said project or redemption of the City's bonds or notes issued therefor, or to be budgeted as an offset to the amounts to be collected for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds

Date: November 17, 2021

Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance the appropriation referred to herein.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 19(c) of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the City for expenditures made after the effective date of this ordinance for the purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the City. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this ordinance and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Council relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and as to executing agreements for credit enhancements, are hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of the City.

- Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:
 - (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money, or
 - (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect immediately, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing ordinance, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in the "The Press & Sun-Bulletin," a newspaper published in Binghamton, New York, having a general circulation in the City and hereby designated the official newspaper of said City for such publication.

State Environmental Quality Review **Determination of Type II Action**

Project Number: None

This Notice is issued pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act) of the Environmental Conservation Law.

Nature of action. An ordinance authorizing issuance of \$2,750,000 serial bonds to finance improvements to Mirabito Staduim, owned by the City of Binghamton. The projects are for (i) renovation of the existing visitor clubhouse; (ii) renovation of the existing home clubhouse (including women's clubhouse); (iii) construction of a stand-alone weight room; and (iv) installation of video surveillance (including player/staff parking, entrances to the home and visitor clubhouses, female staff facilities and umpire facilities).

Findings. The City of Binghamton City Council has determined that the proposed action described above is a Type II action based on §617.5 Type II C (1) maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility, (2) replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building or fire codes, and (21) minor temporary uses of land having negligible or no permanent impact on the environment; and no further environmental review is necessary.

IN THE MATTER OF THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON QUALIFYING FOR EXEMPTIONS FROM EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEDURE LAW ARTICLE 2 HEARING REQUIREMENT FOR THE MAIN STREET CORRIDOR STUDY & SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT (P.I.N. 9754.37)

WHEREAS, Main Street (NYS Route 17C) within the City of Binghamton is an Urban Minor Arterial whose primary function is to serve large volumes of east-west traffic within and through the City of Binghamton; and

WHEREAS, after conducting a study, the City of Binghamton ("City") has identified safety deficiencies along an approximately 1.7-mile segment of Main Street (NYS Route 17C) between the Main Street intersections with Floral Avenue and Front Street ("Project Corridor"); and

WHEREAS, the study revealed a high pedestrian-vehicle crash rate, with an average of 12 crashes occurring annually during the 2011-2015 time period, with one fatal accident occurring in 2012; and

WHEREAS, Main Street (NYS Route 17C) within the Project Corridor is owned and maintained by the City; and

WHEREAS, the City is proposing to undertake a project to address and remedy the safety deficiencies that have been identified within the Project Corridor ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the specific purpose for acquiring the fee interest in and to a portion of the Map 1 Parcel is to replace the existing sidewalk with sidewalk that includes an ADA compliant curb ramp; and

WHEREAS, the location and size of the proposed fee interest area to be acquired in the Map 4 Parcel is an approximately 47 square feet narrow, rectangular shaped area abutting Main Street at the northeast corner of the intersection of Main Street and Matthews Street; and

WHEREAS, the specific purpose for acquiring the fee interest in and to a portion of the Map 4 Parcel is to replace the existing sidewalk, a portion of which previously was constructed outside of the City's property boundary line; and

WHEREAS, the location and size of the proposed fee interest area to be acquired in the Map 8 Parcel is an approximately 134 square feet rectangular shaped area at the southwest corner of the intersection of Main Street and Front Street; and

WHEREAS, the specific purpose for acquiring the fee interest in and to a portion of the Map 8 Parcel is to replace the existing sidewalk, a portion of which previously was constructed outside of the City's property boundary line; and

WHEREAS, the location and size of the proposed fee interest area to be acquired in the Map 9 Parcel is an approximately 111 square feet triangular shaped area at the northeast corner of the intersection of Main Street and Front Street; and

WHEREAS, the specific purpose for acquiring the fee interest in and to a portion of the Map 9 Parcel is to replace the existing sidewalk with sidewalk that includes an ADA compliant curb ramp; and

WHEREAS, fee title to the Map 1 Parcel currently is vested in Gurshan Properties, LLC. and

WHEREAS, fee title to the Map 4 Parcel currently is vested in James M Spear; and

WHEREAS, fee title to the Map 8 Parcel currently is vested in Lucky 13 Acquisitions, LLC. and

WHEREAS, fee title to the Map 9 Parcel currently is vested in 4 Main Street LLC; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of the New York Eminent Domain Procedure Law ("EDPL") and the Uninform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Assistance Act of 1973 and its implementing regulations, the City has caused to be appraised the real property interests that it seeks to acquire in and to portions of the Map 1 Parcel, Map 4 Parcel, Map 8 Parcel and Map 9 Parcel, has had such appraisals reviewed by an independent appraiser, has established the highest approved appraisal amounts as the amounts that it believes represents just compensation to be paid for the acquisition of such real property interests, and has communicated to the owners of the Map 1 Parcel, Map 4 Parcel, Map 8 Parcel and Map 9 Parcel written offers to purchase such real property interests for one hundred percentum of the just compensation amounts so established; and

WHEREAS, EDPL Article 2 requires, as a condition precedent to acquiring title by means of an EDPL Article 4 acquisition proceeding, that the City conduct a public hearing to inform the public and to review the public use to be served by the proposed Project and the impact on the environment and residents of the locality where the proposed Project will be constructed unless such Project is exempt from the EDPL Article 2 hearing requirements in accordance with EDPL §206; and

WHEREAS, the City is of the opinion that the Project and the subject real property acquisitions qualify for exemptions from the EDPL Article 2 public hearing requirement on the basis of exemptions provided pursuant to EDPL 206(A) and (D); and

WHEREAS, EDPL §206 (A) provides that the City will be exempt from compliance with the provisions of Article 2 when, pursuant to other state, federal, or local law or regulation it considers and submits factors similar to those enumerated in EDPL §204 (B) to a state, federal, or local government agency, board, or commission before proceeding with the acquisition and obtains a license, a permit, a certificate of public convenience of necessity, or other similar approval from such agency, board, or commission; and

WHEREAS, the factors enumerated in subdivision (B) of EDPL §204 are: (1) the public use, benefit or purpose to be served by the proposed public Project; (2) the approximate location for the proposed public Project and the reasons for the selection of that location; (3) the general effect of the proposed Project on the environment and residents of the locality; and (4) such other factors as it considers relevant; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Project is a Locally Administered Federal Aid Transportation Project administered by the City; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Project is being progressed by the City, with oversight by the New York State Department of Transportation ("NYSDOT"), in accordance with the requirements of the NYSDOT "Procedures for Locally Administered Federal Aid Projects" manual ("LPM"), the NYSDOT "Project Development Manual" ("PDM") and other applicable NYSDOT regulations and policies; and

WHEREAS, in order to progress to the Project through scoping, design and acquisition phases, as established by NYSDOT, it was necessary for the City to obtain NYSDOT and Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") approval that the City has satisfied the requirements of FHWA and NYSDOT, as set forth in the LPM, PDM and other applicable statutes, regulations and policies; and

WHEREAS, in order to obtain FHWA and NYSDOT approval of the Project, it was necessary for the City to submit to NYSDOT and FHWA a document known as an Initial Project Scoping/Final Design Report ("Design Report") addressing, among other things, the location and details of the Project, as well as information and documentation demonstrating compliance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 ("NEPA") and the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed public Project is being progressed as a NEPA Class II action (Categorical Exclusion) in accordance with the NYSDOT Environmental Action Plan, 23 CFR 771.117(c), because it does not individually or cumulatively have a significant environmental impact and is one of the project types described in the "C" list as a Federally-funded project that receives less than \$5,000,000 of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, on or about April 15, 2021, NYSDOT concurred with this classification, all of which is set forth in the Design Report; and

WHEREAS, the City is designated as the lead agency for purposes of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (hereinafter "SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, the City classified the proposed Project as a Type II action per NYCRR Part 617.5(c)(2) (replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site,) and 617.5(c)(22) (installation of traffic control devices on existing streets, roads and highways) and has completed the SEQR review process; and

WHEREAS, the City has considered the general effect of the proposed Project on the residents of the locality in which the proposed Project is to be undertaken and has included such analysis in the Design Report; and

WHEREAS, in the course of satisfying the requirements of the LPM and DPM, the City has considered and submitted to NYSDOT factors similar to those enumerated in EDPL §204(B), and NYSDOT and FHWA have issued their approvals of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project and the location, nature, duration and extent of the acquisition of the real property interests in and to portions of the Map 1 Parcel, Map 4 Parcel, Map 8 Parcel and Map 9 Parcel are de minimis in nature so that the public interest will not be prejudiced by the construction of the Project.

Professional Services Proposal – Conditions Assessment and Preliminary Design

Dear Juliet:

Environmental Design & Research, Landscape Architecture, Engineering, & Environmental Services, D.P.C. (EDR) is pleased to provide this proposal for a Conditions Assessment and Preliminary Design services in association with the Ross Park Carousel Restoration and Relocation, located in the City of Binghamton, Broome County, New York (hereafter, the Project). EDR has previously prepared a Restoration and Relocation Plan under a contract with the City of Binghamton (hereafter, the City) dated August 24, 2022. The services described below are provided as a change order to this existing contract.

Project Understanding

The City submitted the Restoration and Relocation Plan to the New York State Historic Preservation Office (NYSHPO) in March 2023. On April 6, 2023, the NYSHPO provided a response indicating the following:

At this time, we have no substantive comments or requested changes to these documents. Please keep in mind that continued consultation with our office is necessary for the National Register requirement portion of this project as well as the grant-funded portion of our project. Our office is aware of the new proposed location but cannot offer a formal determination of eligibility/re-listing of the structure until the move is complete. Our grants team will engage with the Survey and National Register unit as necessary to help coordinate these details of the project.

Subsequent to this correspondence, the City and NYSHPO continued consultation regarding the Project. The Restoration and Relocation Plan submitted to NYSHPO was prepared under the assumption that the carousel housing would need to be disassembled, moved and reassembled

at a new site. However, as described in July 31, 2023 correspondence, the NYSHPO will allow for a newly constructed housing as long as specific conditions are met:

We affirm that this project must be completed according to the original scope that was funded and the agreed upon grant contract. If the condition of the housing has worsened considerably, this must be documented accordingly. Any new housing constructed around the relocated carousel must utilize the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Reconstruction and a schematic design must be reviewed by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) prior to undertaking any work. A fully enclosed and winterized new structure is not an eligible expense for this grant program and will jeopardize the carousel's National Register status.

The following scope of services is provided based on these conditions from NYSHPO.

Proposed Scope of Work

Task 1. Conditions Assessment

EDR will conduct an additional site visit to supplement and expand on the condition assessment that was completed as part of the Restoration and Relocation Plan. The assessment will:

- Provide a more detailed evaluation of the existing shelter by further documenting the existing material condition and details of construction;
- Include a desktop evaluation of the existing shelter to determine if it complies with current building code requirements; and
- Include a feasibility assessment regarding the structural integrity of the shelter, to determine if it is able to be reassembled in its new location.

The findings of the conditions assessment will be documented in an illustrated report, suitable for submission to NYSHPO.

Task 2. Preliminary Schematic Design

Based on the findings of the conditions assessment, EDR will prepare a preliminary schematic design for a relocated shelter that is constructed either of entirely new materials or a combination of new and existing materials. EDR will provide schematic level drawings that will indicate the shelter layout, materials of construction, and extent of reuse of existing materials as possible.

In addition, EDR will prepare a rendering of the proposed carousel structure and surrounding site based on the preliminary design compatible with the proposed site design. The rendering will also include the layout of all relevant landscape and site features as depicted in the Restoration and Relocation Plan previously prepared by EDR. It is anticipated that these schematic level drawings and rendering will be utilized to obtain NYSHPO approval of the proposed structure prior to moving into full Design Development phase.

Task 3. Cultural Resources Consultation and Coordination

Due to the historic nature of the carousel and shelter, and its inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places, the proposed Conditions Assessment and Schematic Design will require close consultation with the NYSHPO. As noted in the July 31, 2023 NYSHPO correspondence, and due to the historic nature of the carousel, all proposed work must meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Restoration and Reconstruction. Ross Park and its carousel have also been designated by the City of Binghamton's Commission on Architecture and Urban Design (CUAD) as Local Landmarks. The proposed restoration and relocation of the carousel will also require coordination with and approval from the CUAD.

Schedule

EDR will initiate work on the scope of services described herein following approval of the change order by the City. EDR will work with the City to develop a schedule that will meet any relevant permitting or funding deadlines.

Compensation

EDR proposes to complete the tasks in this scope of services on a lump-sum basis for \$39,000. This fee includes reimbursable expenses associated with travel and equipment, based on EDR's current rate schedule. A breakdown of the anticipated fee by task is presented below (for Client information only, not for billing purposes).

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500,000 FROM THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF PARKS, RECREATION AND HISTORIC PRESERVATION TO RENOVATE AND RELOCATE THE ROSS PARK CAROUSEL RENOVATION & RELOCATION

WHEREAS, the City of Binghamton is eligible to receive a \$500,000 grant from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation through the Environmental Protection Fund Municipal Grant Program to renovate and relocate the Ross Park Carousel; and

WHEREAS, there is no required City match; that, pending reimbursement, funding for the project shall be drawn from the general fund; that the Commissioner of Parks and Recreation will be the grant project manager; and that the anticipated date of project completion is May 29, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to accept said grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby:

RESOLVE that the Council of the City of Binghamton does hereby accept a grant from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation through the Environmental Protection Fund Municipal Grant Program in the amount of \$500,000 to renovate and relocate the Ross Park Carousel; and be it further

RESOLVED that there is no required City match; that, pending reimbursement, funding for the project shall be drawn from the general fund; that the Commissioner of Parks and Recreation will be the grant project manager; and that the anticipated date of project completion is May 29, 2017; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into and execute an agreement, approved as to form and content by the Office of Corporation Counsel, with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation to accept such grant.

Task 3. Cultural Resources Consultation and Coordination

Due to the historic nature of the carousel and shelter, and its inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places, the proposed Conditions Assessment and Schematic Design will require close consultation with the NYSHPO. As noted in the July 31, 2023 NYSHPO correspondence, and due to the historic nature of the carousel, all proposed work must meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Restoration and Reconstruction. Ross Park and its carousel have also been designated by the City of Binghamton's Commission on Architecture and Urban Design (CUAD) as Local Landmarks. The proposed restoration and relocation of the carousel will also require coordination with and approval from the CUAD.

Schedule

EDR will initiate work on the scope of services described herein following approval of the change order by the City. EDR will work with the City to develop a schedule that will meet any relevant permitting or funding deadlines.

Compensation

EDR proposes to complete the tasks in this scope of services on a lump-sum basis for \$39,000. This fee includes reimbursable expenses associated with travel and equipment, based on EDR's current rate schedule. A breakdown of the anticipated fee by task is presented below (for Client information only, not for billing purposes).

Task	Fee
Task 1. Conditions Assessment	\$ 13,000
Task 2. Schematic Design	\$ 23,000
Task 3. Cultural Resources Consultation	\$ 3,000

Total \$39,000
