


## GHG Inventory - 2006




- 2006 Greenhouse Gas Inventory
  - Completed in 2009 using 2006 as a base year
  - Calculated using proprietary program through ICLEI
  - Established emission target reduction of 25% below 2006 levels by 2025.

## 2006 Emissions from Government Operations by Fuel Type (2% of Total)







# GHG Inventory – 2022



- 2022 Greenhouse Gas Inventory (so far) for the City (does not include community)
  - Calculated using publicly-available tool developed by USEPA
  - Includes City-owned and Community-owned sources
  - Preliminary calculations show reduction due to City-led initiatives and improvements to New York State's energy grid



## Climate Smart Communities



- How the Process Works
  - New York State points-based system
  - Points earned for climate actions in multiple categories
  - Emphasis on reducing GHG emissions AND increasing community preparedness



**100** CERTIFIED SINCE 2014

- Scoring/Certification
  - 120 points for Bronze Certification
  - 300 points for Silver Certification
- Access to grants
  - Participating communities are eligible for 50/50 grants to pay for projects that are part of certification or Climate Action Plans, including fleet management, GHG mitigation, flood mitigation and planning, and more...






## Collaboration with Broome County
